 Burnt sienna

- 2 supports (8x10 to 12x16)

canvas, canvas board or Masonite board

- Paper Towels
- Thinner / Turpentine
- Filbert or flat brushes (larger sizes are preferred) #8 and #12
- Palette knives
- Glass palette (larger size is preferred; plastic is acceptable)
- Razor scraper
- Drop cloth
- French easel or pochade box
- Box or spacers to transport wet paintings
